# MARCH-APRIL 2019 SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL GRANT PROGRAMS WORKSHOPS

**Learn how to apply for the new and recurring ODOT Safe Routes to School Grant Program funds.**

In the spring and summer of 2019, the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) will solicit proposals for the next round of Safe Routes to School (SRTS) grant funding. ODOT staff will present a program overview and answer questions about these upcoming opportunities. The presentation will cover SRTS Infrastructure and Non-infrastructure Programs specifics including, timeline, eligibility, proposal selection process, match requirements, and proposal development tips. The target audiences include city, county, tribes, transit agency staff and interested public school representatives. All workshops are open to the general public.

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## Upcoming Grant Program details:

### Non-Infrastructure Grants

These grants fund education, encouragement and enforcement to address barriers for students walking and rolling to school.

Funding available this round: approx. \$500,000 annually

Request Maximum: \$100,000 annually

Eligible Entities: School Districts, Non-profits, Local Road Authorities

### Project Identification Program

This program provides a service to communities to identify infrastructure projects addressing barriers to students walking and rolling to school in a new local plan.

Consultant services will be provided to 20 communities

Eligible Entities: School Districts, Tribes, Road Authorities

### Rapid Response Infrastructure Grants

These grants fund infrastructure projects that are eligible for the SRTS Infrastructure Competitive Grant program but cannot wait for the 2021 competition and funding allocation.

Funding available this round: \$1.833 million

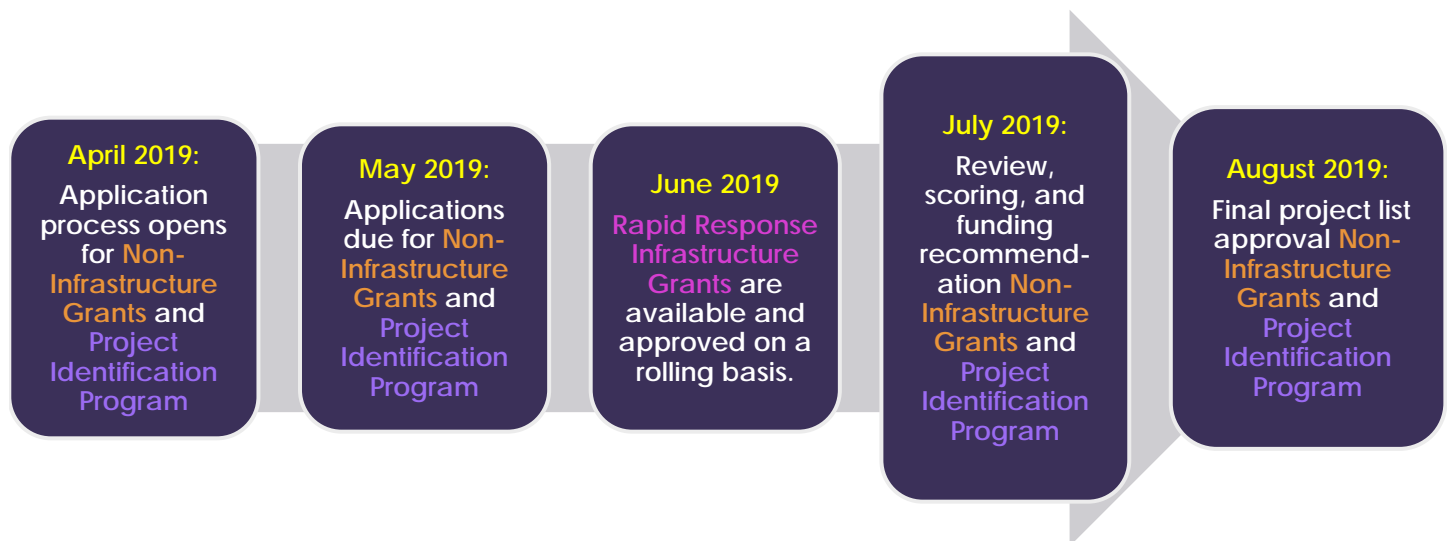
Request Minimum: \$0

Request Maximum: \$500,000  
Eligible Entities: Cities, Counties, ODOT, Tribes
