

Safe Routes to School: Education Programs

Education Resources and Grant Opportunities

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Safe Routes to School (SRTS) refers to efforts that improve street conditions, educate and encourage children to safely walk (by foot or mobility device) or bike to school.

ODOT has two main types of SRTS education programs: local grants and technical assistance. These programs focus on education, and engagement to assure awareness and safe use of walking and biking routes. These efforts prioritize underserved communities.

2020-2022 FUNDED EDUCATION GRANTEES

The public call for SRTS Education projects for the grant years of 2020-22 closed in May 2019. ODOT received 28 applications, totaling over \$4.4 million in funding requests. The amount available for allocation was \$2.3 million. Eleven new grantees were selected (see interactive map) through a competitive process that prioritized safety, equity, communication, collaboration and coordination.

A Comprehensive Approach

Safe Routes to School (SRTS) programs usually start by identifying barriers to students walking and rolling in your community. Solutions to overcome these barriers may include community engagement, walk/bike safety education for students, building safe places for kids to walk and roll such as sidewalks and safe street crossings, and more. ODOT has programs and grants to help you get started!

- <u>Education grants</u> for all levels and planning services (applications due in early 2022)
- Construction grants and project identification services (applications due in early 2022)
- Planning and technical assistance (year-round options available)
- <u>Exciting programs</u> for schools and students (year-round options available)

Application materials can be found on ODOT's SRTS website starting January 2022.

FEBRUARY 1 -

MARCH 18, 2022*: SUMMER 2022*: OCTOBER 1, 2022*: Education Grant Application Due SUMMER 2022*: Funds allocated and Grant Work Begins

*Dates are approximate and will be final by January 2022.
